1. A NEW THEORY OF THE "FLOOD". November 1944. This was a 13 page single spaced paper that launched the theory of Impact Geology. The insight came from the union of two articles, one in the Saturday Evenig Post....WHEN THE COMET STRUCK, and the other in Readers Digest....OUR SEARCH FOR THE EARLIEST AMERICAN. These two, started Impact Geology.
2. THE GEOLOGY OF THE MOON. Dec. 1947. An eleven page article published in POPULAR ASTRONOMY containing most of the basic ideas that later went in to the book TARGET:EARTH.
3. ON THE ADVANCEMENT OF SCIENCE. Nov. 1948. A four page article published in POPULAR ASTRONOMY.
4. THE ORIGIN OF THE CAROLINA BAYS. 1948. Nine pages. Not published.
5. THEORIES OF THE ORIGIN OF THE EARTH. 1949. 13 pp. Not published.
6. LEGENDS OF THE DELUGE & GEOLOGIC LEGENDS. 1950 Not published.
7. THE ORIGIN OF THE CAROLINA BAYS & THE ORIENTATED LAKES OF ALASKA. A six page paper appearing in POPULAR ASTRONOMY in 1951.
8. UNIFORMITARIAN GEOLOGY VERSUS COSMIC COLLISION GEOLOGY. 1950. A nine page paper not published.
9. IS METEORITIC COLLISION THE MISSING FORCE IN GEOMORPHOLOGY? 1951. A nine page paper not published.
10. A REPLY TO HARRISON' BROWN'S REVIEW OF "EARTH IN UPHEAVAL." 1951. A letter published by SCIENTIFIC MONTHLY.

11. MYSTERIOUS CRATER ELEGANTE. 1952. A nine page paper published in SCIENTIFIC MONTHLY with photographs and illustrations.
12. A CRANK'S-EYE VIEW. Feb. 1952. A reply to Dr. LaFleaur who had attacked amateur scientists as cranks. It received more replys and favorable attention than any other kelly paper.
13. TARGET:EARTH. 1953. First hard cover book written on Impact geology, 263 pages, many photographs and illustrations. Co-authored with Dr. Frank Dacheille and published privately in Pensacola, Florida.
14. ORIGIN OF SURFACE FEATURES OF THE EARTH AND MOON. August 1955.
15. PLEISTOCENE GRAVELS OF DEATH VALLEY AND THE GREAT BASIN. 1956/
16. SOME OBSERVATIONS ON COSMOLOGY...COLLISION & PHILOSOPHY. 1957.
17. THE STORY OF COLLISION GEOLOGY. 1958. Some personal philosophy.
18. METEORITICS. 1958. A report on the work of Canadian geologists.
19. DOWN UNDER AND OFF TO ONE SIDE. December 1958- 1959. The log of a trip to Hawaii, Fiji, New Zealand, Tasmania and Australia, 237 pages with emphasis on geology. That part of trip in Australia in company of the Niningers. Tried hard to get a publisher for this work but failed.
20. PREHISTORIC INDIAN ARTIFACTS FOUND NEAR CARLSBAD, CALIF.1960` San Diego Museum of man authorities came to look but would not make any comments...afraid of flood evidence.
21. BERNOULLI'S LAW APPLIED TO HARBOR ENTRANCES AND BRIDGES. Nov. 1959 A 19 page privately published booklet containing photographs maps and illustrations published privately. Sent to U. S. Corp of Engineers. This was an important discovery that Nature makes use of Bernoulli's Law and the Venturi Principle.
22. ERRATIC BOULDERS ON POINT LOMA, CALIFORNIA. Nov. 1962 These erratics pointed out to the National Park Service who have charge of the Old Point Loma Lighthouse....but no interest.
23. ERRATIC SEDIMENTS & METEORITIC KETTLE LAKES. 1963. Two papers under one soft cover (8 x 11) privately published under the title of METEORITIC COLLISION:A DYNAMIC FORCE IN EARTH HISTORY. Many mpps, photos and illustrations 54 pages. Many sold.

- 24. ON NATURAL LAW AND THE SURVIVAL OF THE FITTEST. Nov. 1963
Sent for publication but refused...too much flood evidence.
- 25. ORIGIN OF THE HEAVY METALS IN THE EARTH'S CRUST. Aug. 1965
Sent out for publication but refused....unorthodox.
- 26. CONTINENTAL DRIFT: IS IT A COMETARY IMPACT PHENOMENON? 1966.
A 100 page soft cover (8 x 11) soft cover book started in 1963 but not finished until 1966. Many maps, illustrations and photographs. A critical examination of the Plate theory.
- 27. A GEOLOGIC HISTORY OF THE BUENA VISTA LAGOON, CARLSBAD. SEPT.1966.
- 28. FROM HYPOTHESIS, TO THEORY, TO FACT, BY PICTORIAL ILLUSTRATION.
Jan. 1968. A strong criticism not offered for publication.
- 29. THE FIXATION OF A SCIENTIFIC HYPOTHESIS BY PICTORIAL LEARNING.
Jan. 1968. Another strong criticism not published.
- 30. "PLEISTOCENE OVERKILL": FACT OR FICTION. Mar. 1968. Sent out but refused publication.
- 31. IS MICROSCOPIC GOLD AN IMPACT FALLOUT PRODUCT? July 1968. Log of a trip to Carlin Nevada gold mine to study possibility this gold is product of vaporization by major impact and the condensation fallout of the microscopic gold dust.
- 32. A WATER IMPACT HYPOTHESIS FOR THE SIERRA MADERA STRUCTURE IN WEST TEXAS. Dec. 10, 1968. This paper ended the long controversy over the origin of this structure between orthodox geologists and those who believed in the meteoritic impact origin. This paper was published in METEORITICS.
- 33. MARE ORIENTALE: MYSTERIOUS LUNAR BULLS-EYE. Feb. 24, 1969.
Sixteen pages with illustrations. Publication refused.
- 34. SEA FLOOR SPREADING: FACT OR HOAX. Sept. 1970. Not sent out.
- 35. SEA FLOOR SPREADING: FACT OR FABLE. Oct. 26, 1970. Returned.
- 36. ARE MASCOMS MOON BELLS? Jan. 1971. Sent out but refused.

37. MARE ORIENTALE: DYNAMICS OF ORIGIN. May 30, 1971. A ten page preliminary paper not sent out for publication.
38. MARE ORIENTALE: THE DYNAMICS OF ORIGIN. Nov. 14, 1971. Sent it to John O'Keefe who said cut it down to the one grain of wheat you have discovered. Never sent for publication.
39. IS MARS A PRODUCT OF GRAVITATIONAL DISRUPTION? Nov 21, 1971. First attempt to explain huge canyon and volcano on Mars.
40. PLANETARY DISRUPTION and/or WHAT-THE-HELLE! Dec. 10 1971. A funny with scientific overtones never sent for publication.
41. THE ORIGIN OF MARS AND THE ASTEROIDS: A SPECULATION. Dec. 14, 1971.
42. GRAVITATIONAL DISRUPTION OF MARS: A NEW SPECULATION. Jan. 1972
43. THE GIGANTIC CONE STRUCTURES OF THE SIERRA NEVADA. Jan.20, 1972. Proposing that giant cones are indicators of massive impact.
44. THE CARLSBAD ASTROBLEME. Aug. 24, 1972. Wrote short paper and sent to Carlton Moore who came out to look at it...said he get a graduate student to come and investigate. Never did.
45. THE GRAVITATIONAL DISRUPTION OF MARS: SPECULATION, THEORY OR FACT. May 30, 1973. Offered for publication but refused.
46. EDUCATION VERSUS CREATIVITY. Aug. 6, 1973. A rewrite of the paper done in 1962. Not published.
47. MERCURY'S GIANT BULLS-EYE. May 10, 1974. Not sent out for publication, much same content as paper on Mare Orientale.
48. CREATIVITY: CAN IT BE DISSECTED, CAN IT BE TAUGHT? June 21, 1974 A reply to an article in SCIENCE on this subject.
49. HOW DID THE EGYPTIANS BUILD THE PYRAMIDS WITH ONLY THE ROPE, ROLLER AND LEAVER? Sept. 27, 1974. Not sent out for publication but made a scale wooden model to test theory.
50. INTRODUCTION TO IMPACT AND GRAVITATIONAL DISRUPTIVE THEORY. Nov. 14, 1974. A philosophical paper not sent out.

51. FRACTURE MOONS AND GLACIAL POLISH ON CARLSBAD COBBLESTONES. Fracture moons on cobbles as indicator of oceanic flooding by the striking together. June 1975. Not offered for publication.
52. THE GREAT SNOWSTORM OF 1882 IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. This was written for the local historical society from family records.
53. LOG OF A TRIP TO KITT PEAK. March 21-22-23, 1976. This was not offered for publication but copies sent to Harvey Nininger and Glenn Huss who were on the trip. Also a copy to Frank Dachille. This paper proposed that Kitt Peak might be the central peak of a very large impact crater being made up of giant cone structures. Also, that a wide strip of western America from Canada down into Mexico might be the pathway of a gravitational ripoff as described in the previous papers on the disruption of Mars.
54. KRAKATOA. Dec. 6, 1976. A review of the book Krakatoa for the purpose of future reference in my work.
55. LOG OF A TRIP ON THE SEA OF CORTEZ. Feb. 1977. Not offered for publication but several copies sent to people on the trip including Dr. Walker, the scientist representing the University of California at San Diego in geology, biooogy (whale watching) and botany...his specialty. A very interesting and worthwhile trip visiting the islands and mainland of the Gulf.
56. LOG OF A TRIP TO THE SAN PEDRO MARTIER, BAJA CALIFORNIA. June 19 to 23, 1980. This trip with the San Diego Museum of Nat. History. Leaders were a geologist, a botanist and ornothologist. I saw lots of oceanic flood gravel, mostly cobblestone but some large boulder gravel as high as 2500 feet above sea level.
57. PLEISTOCENE OCEANIC FLOOD GRAVELS OF CALIFORNIA. This paper a long one begun in 1980 with several trips to take photographs. Manuscript begun in July of 1981, finished in December 1981. It contains new arguments for the actual tilting of the earth due to major impact in relation to the rays of the sun. Also the new observation that the great sand deposits of the earth are of very recent age and probably oceanic flood deposits that have since been altered by wind.
58. The culmination of all these years of work, IMPACT GEOLOGY, was a hard cover, top quality book of 228 pages, a coffee table type in full color; a picture of some geologic anomaly on almost every page. It came off the press in 1985 at a cost of a little over \$400,000. No effort was made to get a publisher because experience had shown that was impossible.
