School Tours

The last of our 2014-2015 Third Grade School Tours occurred during May and June when we had the third grade students from both Kelly and Magnolia schools visit. Jefferson School had visited previously. They toured the house, the barn, and the park, where they got a presentation on ranching and horsemanship from our expert Marvin Sippel. He continues helping us with this and has the kids learning the basics of, as well as the importance of, a horse on a ranch, and demonstrates rounding up cattle and lassoing them, which the kids enjoy.

Other highlights include seeing the Twin Inns chicken and the Magee Family buggy in the barn. A new display that the kids are very interested in is the local Native American display that focuses on migration from the mountains to the coast, use of metates, grinding stones and a replica of the famous Stone Bear, the California State Archaeological artifact that was discovered in Carlsbad near the Agua Hedionda Lagoon.



Tour of Rancho Santa Margarita

Nine CHS members enjoyed a very informative tour of the Rancho Santa Margarita House, located inside Camp Pendleton in May. This large house has many interesting displays and well documented and presented historical information regarding the first ranch families as well as interesting details of the house under the care of the US Marine Corp. Since the Base Commander is no longer living there, the tour is now much longer, taking visitors into areas never before accessible to the general public. Displays encompass the time period from Native American settlement to today, with such interesting details as the unmarried girls attic bedroom with the retractable ladder or the "Presidents" room with photos of the various visiting United States Presidents sitting in the same chair in the same spot in a bedroom, or the gravity gate at the front entrance.

Carlsbad Historical Society Collection Policy Excerpt:

Purpose: The Mission of the Carlsbad Historical Society (CHS) is to collect, exhibit, preserve and interpret the history of Carlsbad, the surrounding area, significant landmarks, and institutions. The Carlsbad Historical Society Museum will collect examples of the material culture that illustrate the history of Carlsbad. Artifacts, documents, written materials and memorabilia added to the permanent collection will be used for exhibition, study and documentary purposes. Items sought and accepted for exhibition should relate to the key ideas and events of

the story of Carlsbad History and contribute strongly to the understanding and appreciation of the immigration of Carlsbad residents and subsequent generations. Whenever possible the artifact should have an association with a specific person or institution; an artifact with such an association is preferable to one without.


This quarter we received some significant donations: Paula Tremayne, daughter of former Mayor Claude "Bud" Lewis, gave us many framed proclamations, photographs, artwork and other objects relating to his years of political service to the City of Carlsbad and those as teacher and coach at Carlsbad High School. We received a Victorian rocking chair and footrest from Diane Lantz. Dr. Jerry and Tina Colling discovered, purchased and donated two "Donna Gardner" paintings: one of the historic Kelly Barn and one of the Buena Vista Lagoon Boat house which are now on display. Marv Sippel donated a metate for our Native American display. Lynn Ness, alumni of Carlsbad High and Class of 1960 gifted us original Lancer artwork. She is responsible for the mascot, name and colors. Pattie Gallant generously donated a limited edition "Ted Wade" lithograph of the Twin Inns Log Cabin. And President Ginny Unanue purchased and donated a DVD and accompanying article of Bob Watson, regarding his service on D-Day, which is available for viewing at Magee House.

Proposal for Barn Outside Mural

June 9, 2015, the Vans clothing and shoe company named Carlsbad High School as the grand-prize winner of their sixth annual Vans Custom Culture design competition. Carlsbad High was awarded a \$50,000 donation toward the school's arts education program. Carlsbad High art teacher Kelly Foulk, was very enthusiastic about using some of the winnings to create a historical mural for the side of the barn in Magee Park

Our idea to have a mural painted on the north side of the Shipley-Magee Barn is getting a good reception by City Hall and the Arts Office. We think this could be a collection of significant time peri-

ods and icons of the town, similar to what was done for the "Know Carlsbad" tee-shirts.
