This year's goals for the Historical Society include a major fundraiser in conjunction with the Carlsbad Economic Enhancement Council (CEEC), A DESIGN COMPETITION FOR A MUSEUM BUILDING, a membership drive to quadruple our membership, an enhancement of the Society's role in the community with more frequent programs, increased literature distribution and to establish our permanent office at the Depot.

The Executive Board has determined that the following five committees are vital to the continuing vitality of the Society. Please indicate the one (or more), in which you will participate:

- Membership (Mailers, leaflets, newsletter, recruitment, etc.)
 Fundraiser (Plan, organize & complete money making activities).
 Publicity (write, draw, telephone and otherwise get the word out about the Society).
 Volunteer (management and organization of the volunteer programs).
 Special Projects (Carillo Ranch, Magee House, the Depot etc.)

Preservation Grant will be used to repair as much of the circa 1930's adobe structures as possible. (Don't forget, the Historical Society is responsible for a 10% matching fund to obtain this Grant); the Ranch House is built near a natural spring, so much of its foundation is threatened by seepage. The interior of the rambling hacienda has been nicely restored by the Parks and Recreation Department. Meanwhile, the fledgling Carlsbad Arboretum Foundation is working to acquire use of the designated open space directly downstream from the rancho for development of a botanical garden/nature preserve. The group also hopes to incorporate Carrillo Ranch as a part of its oasis of native plants and stream-side habitat. The Carlsbad Parks and Recreation Dept. has approved this concept as conforming with its general aim to keep Carrillo Ranch as a passive park, but many details are still to be worked out before these plans become reality.

Carrillo Ranch is named for film and TV star Leo Carrillo, who bought Matthew Kelly's 10,000 acre homestead in 1935 and built his own romanticized version of an early California rancho. The low adobe buildings were built from local material, on the site, by Mexican workers. The Ranch includes the hacienda, a large split level stable, barn, outbuildings and a hillside Indian-style cottage for Carrillo's wife, Deedee.<

PRESERVATION COMMISSION:

Created to provide a vehicle for City action to preserve the Cultural Resources of Carlsbad, the Carlsbad Historic Preservation Commission has now successfully recommended the designation of four landmarks in addition to the Santa Fe Depot, as historic sites. The Commission is also in the process of presenting seven (7) more sites for consideration by the City Council, who have the final authority for designation locally.

In the two years since its creation, the Commission has obtained more than \$100,000 of State Preservation Funds for the restoration of the Santa Fe Depot and the stabilization of the Carrillo Ranch House. It has also sponsored an all day seminar on Cultural Resources and the Planning Process, which was well attended and appreciated by preservation officials from other communities and members of the Carlsbad City Planning and Engineering Staffs. The Commission's most recent accomplishment has been the "rescue" of the Gaus house on Jefferson St.; slated for demolition because of expansion plans of the Union Church, the house will now be moved to a new site, thanks to insistence by the Commission that the availability of the house be advertised and half of its moving costs be paid for by the church.

Current Commission members are: Roy Blackford, Kay Christiansen, Marje Howard-Jones, Brian Robertson and John Swenson.<

CARRILLO RANCH:

Carrillo Ranch continues to be one of Carlsbad's secret treasures, but proposed development on adjacent acres indicate that its glories will soon be available to all. Now accessible only by road over private land, the Ranch is at the bottom of a valley just south of Palomar Airport Rd. and east of the new Scripps Hospital site. A \$90,000 State

2.06 WOOD TREATMENT

- A. Shop pressure treat and deliver to site ready for installation, wood materials requiring pressure impregnated preservatives. Ensure site-sawn ends are similarly treated. Allow preservative to cure prior to erecting members. Only wood not exposed to view in contact with earth to be pressure treated.

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.01 FRAMING, FURRING, AND STRIPPING

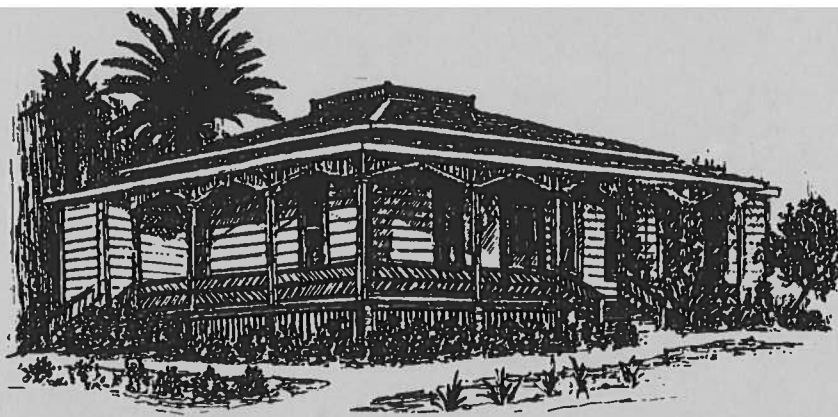
- A. Erect wood framing, furring, stripping and nailing members true to lines and levels. There may be the need to match existing wood deformation due to settlement over the years. Contact Architect for advice.
- B. Construct members of continuous pieces of longest possible lengths or as indicated on the construction documents.

3.02 INSTALLATION OF FINISH CARPENTRY ITEMS

- A. When necessary to cut and fit on site, make material with ample allowance for cutting. Provide trim for scribing and site cutting.
- B. Install hardware and accessories supplied for installation. Install items in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- C. Ensure that electrical items affecting this Section of work are properly placed, complete, and have been inspected by the Architect prior to commencement of installation.

3.04 SCHEDULE

- A. Rough Carpentry Work:
 - 1. Structural and non-structural framing.
 - 2. Preservative treatment of wood members where required.
 - 3. Miscellaneous blocking and canting for roofing system and related metal flashings.

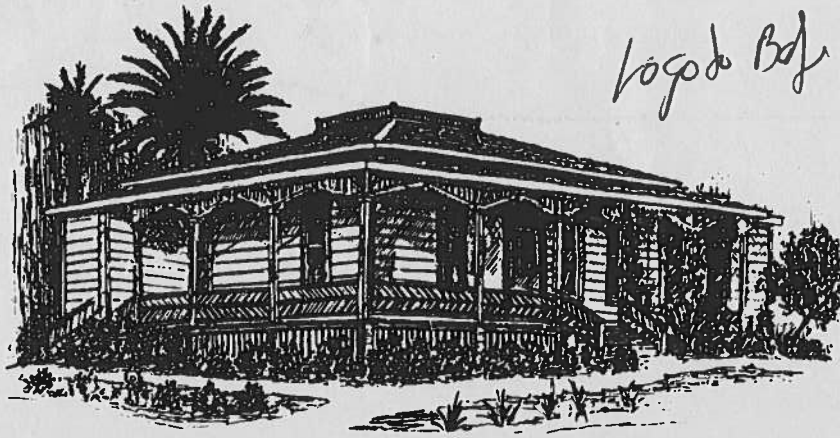

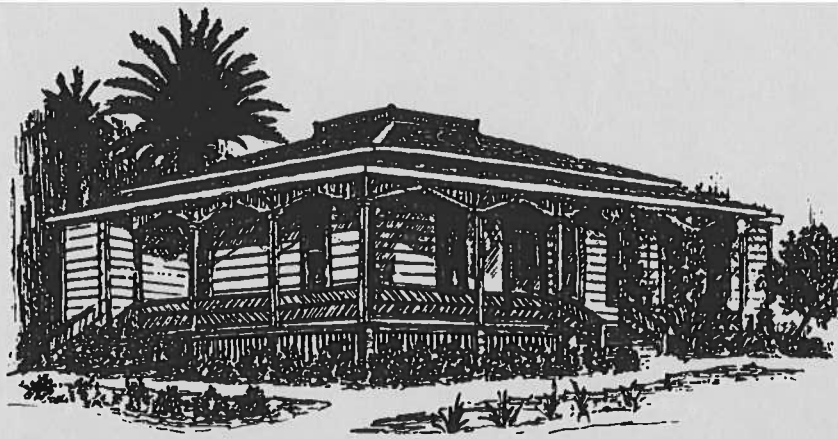

our salute to one of our most venerable and treasured members.

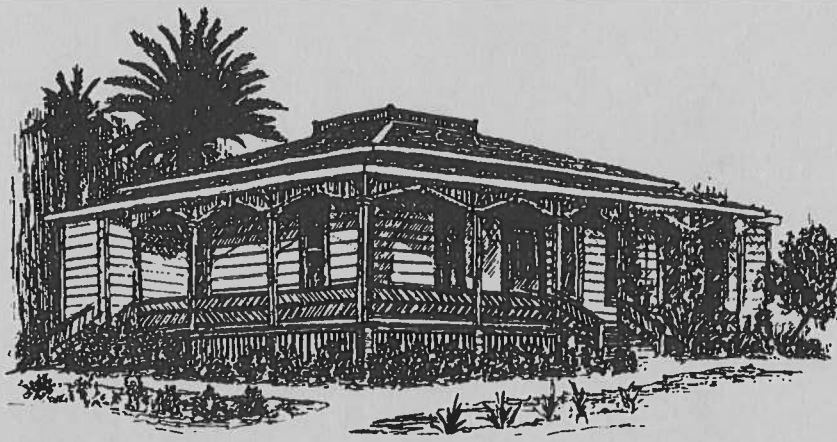
