■ GENERAL MEETING

The last general meeting was billed as a joint session, March 14, with the Oceanside Historical Society. There was only a tiny band of Carlsbad members in attendance at Oceanside High to hear a talk about the history of Oceanside-Carlsbad High School, to view a number of interesting displays, and to get acquainted and share ideas with our neighbor society. The Oceanside Society generously donated a 1923 map of Carlsbad to the Carlsbad Historical Society; and another Oceanside member, George Frakes, sent us an interesting 1930 mailing list originally used by Huckaby's Store.

Our Executive Board will meet at 7:00 a.m.; 1st Tuesday of the month; @ the Depot. The next Executive Board meeting will be May 2, 1989.

It will be a time to share ideas, to talk about Carlsbad history and the role of CHS in the community, and to discuss activities and fund raising ideas. There is a potential for CHS to be a strong positive force in setting a community agenda - we just have to gain members and raise our profile. People have to be aware that we do exist and that we have an important contribution to make.

■ NEW OFFICE DYNAMICS

The Society's museum site behind Alt Carlsbad was donated to us in 1988 by lifetime member **Kay Christiansen**. Soon after the donation, the County Tax Assessor found his way to our door. As a result, our property taxes for the site have been mounting since the land is not yet being used as a museum. But there is hope.... Thanks to the generosity of local builder **Robert Lewis**, a house listed in the City's historic inventory has been offered to the Society for relocation to our site for temporary use as a museum.

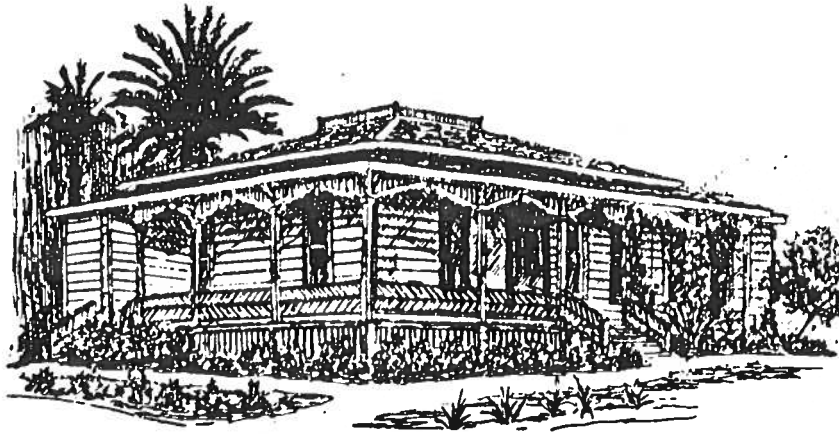
Also, thanks to the generous efforts of **Rick Engineering** and **Bob Ladwig**, the survey work for the development to relocate the structure has been donated.

VTN Southwest engineers **David Ragland** and **Steve Barger** have volunteered to donate the site development plan for processing through the City for permits to relocate and develop the property.

Jim Knowlton of **Geopacifica** has donated his company's services for the soils work needed to support the site plan and design activities as well as the grading plans.

Architect **Ken Chriss** has offered to provide the needed architectural plans, elevations, and the renovation and design enhancements needed for the Design Review process.

DIRECTION SIGNALS: Looking back over the past few years, our Board of Directors are proud of our successful events highlighting local history and the projects that we have embarked on to increase community awareness of Carlsbad's heritage. The Carlsbad Historical Society is a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving significant landmarks, institutions, and memorabilia from Carlsbad's past. It was established in 1975 as part of the city's celebration of the national bicentennial; a time capsule, to be opened in 2076, was buried at Magee Park to mark the occasion.

Since that time, the Carlsbad Historical Society has re-created the turn of the century in the furnishings of its headquarters in the Smith-Shipley-Magee House. Further efforts to develop the historical aspect of Magee Park have included the re-shingling of the Magee barn, restoration of the Shipley outhouse and coordination of a community effort to relocate the original St. Patrick's Church at the park.

These and other historic landmarks have been featured in walking tours sponsored by the Carlsbad Historical Society. Programs offering oral histories and photographic records of Carlsbad's earliest days highlight the annual calendar. Social events at Magee Park and other historic sites are also planned throughout the year and tours are organized to visit landmarks in nearby communities.

Leadership in the preservation of Carlsbad's historic landmarks has included active participation on the city's Historic Sites Committee and consultation with developers regarding standards for restoration of historic structures. Seminars on historic preservation have drawn substantial interest from lay citizens and construction professionals.

The Carlsbad Historical Society provides a significant point of contact for everyone interested in the preservation and enhancement of Carlsbad's historical heritage.

RECENT HISTORY: Third and fourth graders from Kelly and Magnolia Elementary schools recently toured our downtown historical landmarks. Their call to the Carlsbad Historical Society for tour guides led to the enlistment of George and Grace Mason, Ann L'Heureux, Joan and Alan Kindle, Kay Christiansen, and Marge Howard-Jones. Each school sent 70 students (on separate days, thank goodness!), who walked from the Carlsbad Depot to Alt Carlsbad, St. Michaels and then to Magee Park. A highlight of the tour was an 8 minute slide show produced and presented by Alan Kindle. The excursion was part of the schools' new local history curriculum, mandated by the State and enthusiastically pursued by the students. A large collection of daily logs from the Carlsbad Police Department's early years are now being processed and organized at the depot by our esteemed archivist, Natalie Vermilyea, whose own history as Carlsbad's first reserve policewoman makes her highly qualified for the job.

NOTES FROM THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

One of Carlsbad's best kept secrets is Carrillo Rancho, hidden in the valley just south of Palomar Airport Road. Turned over to the city as parkland, it is the recent recipient of a \$400,000 state preservation grant to stabilize its adobe structures over the next five years. Architect Wayne Donaldson, who is heading the project, is a dedicated preservationist, skillful technician and enthusiastic proponent of using yesterday's sites for the real needs of today. In order to best determine the future uses of Carrillo, the Historic Preservation Commission has proposed a joint committee with representatives from the Arts and Parks and Recreation Commissions to meet with it and Donaldson to discuss this and other aspects of the park's development. Some options already mentioned include an equestrian center, entertainment facility (possibly for hire?), arts center,

educational/historic interpretation center....or? Visits to other similarly historic sites are intended, so that we can distill the best for Carrillo's ultimate development.



There is joyous word that the City's annual operating budget for 1989/90 will include provision for the painting of Magee House plus a variety of critical repairs to this much beloved landmark.

Also in the works is a design to commemorate the site of the old Carlsbad School on Pine Avenue at the new CUSD Administration and Senior Center. Although demolition of the old school damaged its original name pediment, the surviving fragments will be worked into a large plaque to remind future residents and visitors that this was where all elementary school children attended classes between 1903 and 1964.

NOTICE: On Tuesday, June 27, there will be a Public Hearing on the city's Capital Improvement Program budget at 6:00 PM in Council Chambers. A member advises she will be present to urge major acceleration of the proposed restoration funding pattern for Carrillo Ranch, now not scheduled for completion until 1999. She is urging those with similar views to attend and to speak, if possible....CORRECTION: The Friends of Carrillo Ranch Quarterly will NOT be distributed with this newsletter as earlier reported. THE HISTORIC MUSEUM TEMPORARY BUILDING is now even closer to reality as we get ready to go to the Design Review Board for approval. Plans have been set in motion to have the historic home at 1101 Knowles relocated to the site behind Alt Carlsbad. Ken Chriss of 4 Design has completed the site plan; Dave Ragland of VTN has completed the grading plan; Jim Knowlton of Geopacifica is completing the soils report; and Michael Hastings and Joe Gallager of Leisure Technology have secured the moving company. Many thanks to all these people for their valuable assistance. What is still needed is a grading contractor to complete the grading and set the footings and electrical, plumbing, carpentry, and painting work to complete the facility and turn it into a temporary museum and office. The project is a critical first step toward an eventual museum complex and will get us off the property tax rolls once and for all.

We (notably Marylynn and Harry Krepps) are also discussing with the city the possibility of waiving all hookup and application fees for this project. This would save us several thousand dollars. A large luncheon will be planned in the future to thank all of the businesses and volunteers on the project at its completion. More on this at our next meeting.

PAIN

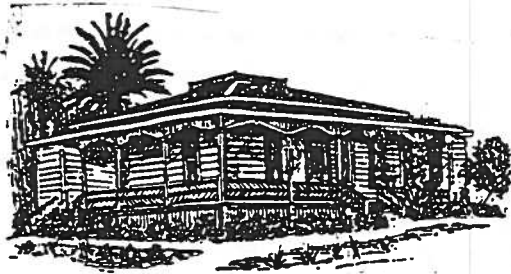

■ MUSEUM: A GROWING REALITY

The Christiansen Way Museum site is rapidly approaching ground breaking and the relocation of the historic residence donated by local builder Robert Lewis.

Mike Hastings and Joseph Gallager of Leisure Technology have joined our list of supporters by donating the total costs of the relocation of the building.

We are currently compiling all of the necessary information and plans needed to make application to the Redevelopment Agency for the permits to relocate the building and to use it for museum purposes.

As you stroll past the site, perhaps stopping to re-visit the sandcastle, you may chance upon one or two of the Geopacifica crew preparing the soils investigation for the site which will now include an underground storage vault. Kay Christiansen has donated the construction of this facility. She hopes that we will soon be able to store and/or display some of the wonderful archeological finds from Carlsbad diggings.

■ TREASURER'S REPORT

The results of the six jazz concerts are now in. We grossed \$1,821.06 against \$575.29 in supplies and expenses for a net of \$1,245.77. This is just over \$200 average net per concert. This sort of income goes a long way towards paying our single greatest expense every year: insurance.

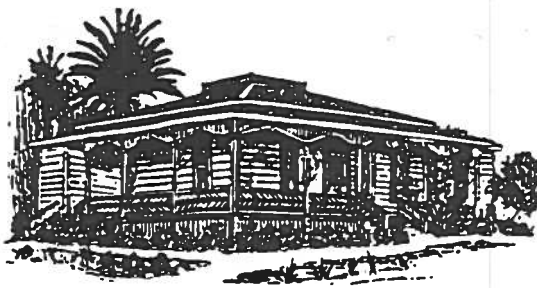
