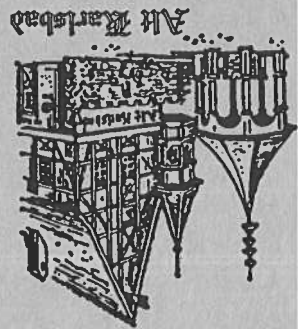

He presented an update on what is developing around the ranch. Outgoing president Kay Christiansen was presented with a Certificate of Appreciation for all her dedicated years of service on behalf of the Society. After introductions of new member Elizabeth Baumgarten, and guests Esther Sotelo and Vestena Snedker, refreshments were served.

It will held in the BARRIO MUSEUM, with sisters Connie Trejo and Ofelia Escobedo to chair the event, assisted by Sylvia Jesse, Bonnie Miller, her daughter Vickie, and Harry Krepps. Located on the south corner of Roosevelt and Walnut Streets, the structure was built in the early 30s by Salvador Sotelo. In 1943, Reyes and Lola Jaurequi bought it for a small grocery store. In 1965, they moved across the street to the present Lola's Market, and the former shop became a warehouse. Last year when the current owners, the visionary sisters, produced the successful Fiesta en el Barrio Carlsbad, September 15, it became the Barrio Museum. As Carlsbad's newest museum, its photo display of original pioneers and historical exhibitions extol the beautiful blend of Carlsbad's two cultures--Mexican and American.

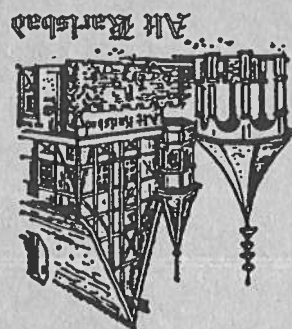

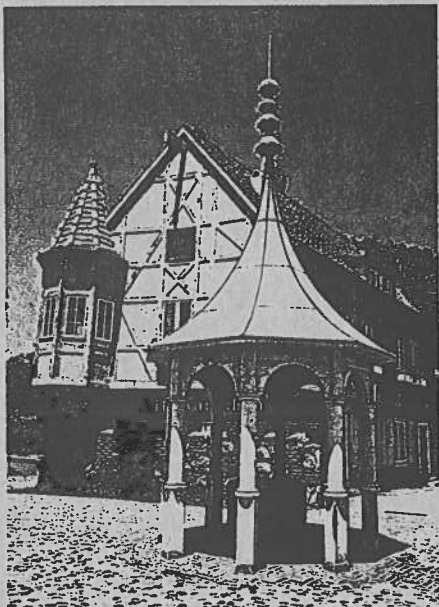

OTHER CARLSBAD HISTORICAL SOCIETY NEWS

March 16, 1992 the Carlsbad Historical Preservation Commission placed the following ALT KARLSBAD WELL historic site plaque at the base of the gazebo: Built in 1953, a replica of Well #9 in Carlsbad, Czechoslovakia, this well replaced the 1885 well dug by homesteader John Frazier. It was the chemical similarity of Frazier's well water to the mineral well of Carlsbad well #9 that led to the name of the new town of Carlsbad.

At the Barrio Membership Tea, MARI ANDERSSON presented to the museum a copy of an ancient document originally issued by Holy Roman Emperor Charles V.

The majestic eucalyptus tree, north corner of Oak and Roosevelt, a sentinel of Barrio Carlos' early pioneer days and slated to be cut down, was spared. The City had the side walk curve around it.

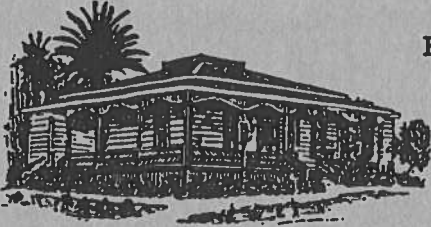

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Kathie Graler, history & museum officer at Camp Pendleton, was our guest speaker June 20 at Heritage House, Magee Park. The area's first recorded visit was that of Spanish explorer Captain Gasper de Portola in 1769. Rancho Margaraita y los Flores, a 125,000 acres working ranch for over a century, was once the property of Pio Pico, last of the Mexican governors. In 1940 the Department of Defense bought it. The 1983 bunkhouse is now a museum, and the 1810 chapel built by Mission Indians, still stands.

Ms. Graler showed films of Pendleton's role in WW II, and the history of the restored hacienda that dates to land-grant times. Now the residence of the Marines' commanding officer, it is a fine piece of Western Americana.

Fiesta en el Barrio, the very successful Mexican Independence Day celebration in Carlsbad's main Latino neighborhood held on September 15, 1991, will not take place this year. Chairpersons Ofelia Escobedo and Connie Trejo said their involvement in the Ad Hoc Master Plan for downtown redevelopment, efforts to find a permanent site for the Centro de Information, the city's Spanish-language library branch, plus running Lola's Seven-Up Market leaves little time for a project on the scale of the fiesta. However, it will be held in 1993.

Thanks to Chairman Harry Krepps and the many volunteers who helped sell refreshments during the June TGIF-Jazz-in-the-Parks concerts at Stagecoach Park, the Society made \$825.65. Concerts are being held at Magee Park in July. The first, July 10, raised \$332.90! With three more at Magee and four in August at Calavera Hills, it looks like a most successful season.

This is our only fund raiser for our future museum. On behalf of the Board, may I express our great appreciation to all the past and future helping hands. Do join us. Just show up and you'll enjoy watching tiny tykes decide what to put on a hot dog, which cookie or soft drink to buy.

Inasmuch as we are concentrating our efforts towards our fund raiser at the Jazz Concerts, the August General Meeting has been cancelled.

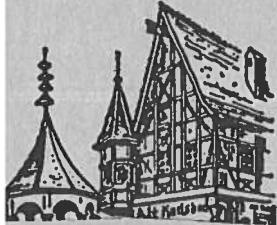

Carlsbad City marked its 40th anniversary on Tuesday, July 14, in the City Hall garden area. Mayor Bud Lewis introduced Ray Ede, who unveiled a plaque on the west wall outside City Hall honoring the first City Council: Mayor Dewey McClellan, Manuel Castorena, George Grober, Ray Ede and Lena Sutton. Sole surviving member, 85-year-old Ede, recalled how the Council worked nearly every night, every day of the week. It met in the Oiler's Rooms, in Twin Inns (now Carlsbad Village Faire) or in the Catholic church now moved to Magee Park. Ede said he ran off the city's budget on a mimeograph machine at the Army and Navy Academy, where he was dean.

The actual date of incorporation was July 16, 1952, but the ceremony was held two days early to coincide with the Council meeting at 6 p.m. Carlsbad Historical Society members helping plan the event were Marge Howard-Jones, Ch. Arts Historical Commission and Patty Cratty, of the Engineering Dept.

As Mayor Lewis commented after introducing many distinguished citizens attending, "As we grew from '52 to the present, many changes occurred, and these individuals played a part."

Chris and I were voters for incorporation as Oceanside was trying to annex us. I have many memories of working with the Council to put the new city together. On Oct. 21, 1975 we formed a City historical society, and Chris was its first president. Your Society is proud of the part it continues to play in the preservation of our city's heritage.
