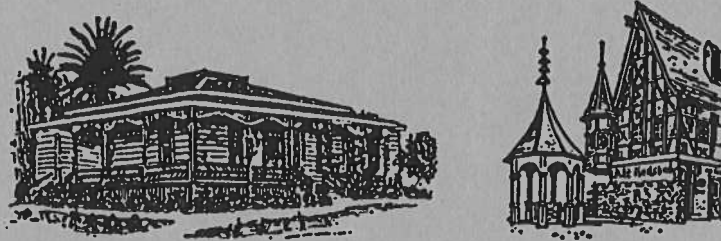


# CARLSBAD HISTORICAL SOCIETY

FEBRUARY NEWSLETTER 1994



The Historical Society Board held its January 19 meeting at Magee House. 1st Vice President Eleanore Hardman, acted as the presiding officer, and called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Officers attending included 2nd V.P. Don Christiansen; Orpha Froblom, secretary; Robert Walwick, treasurer; Edward Maiuro, treasurer elect; Jeannette Samle, archivist; Dorothy Muth, Newsletter editor; Mari Andersson, publicity; Other members present were Kay Christiansen, Ludvik Grigoras, Chuck and Lorna Letts, Connie Trejo, and Lorraine Utzelman.

Minutes of the November 17, 1993 were read and filed. The following business was conducted.

1. The Nominating Committee reported that the office of president had as yet been filled.
2. 2nd Vice President Don Christiansen will conduct the next Board meeting.
3. Edward Maiuro was nominated to serve as Treasurer. Motion carried unanimously
4. Robert Walwick reported: Sterling Account \$8,547. Business Account \$77.21. Contributions of \$1,600 for the John A. Fraizer statue to be erected near the Alt Carlsbad well. San Dieguito Bank on Carlsbad Village Drive serves as the bank for the Society. Mr. Walwick turned over records to elected treasurer Edward Maiuro.

## OLD BUSINESS:

1. Heritage Publishing Company printed a book for the Escondido Historical Society - "Then and Now." Cost of book \$149. Consensus was to table this project until further research.
2. Pros and cons of serving refreshments at the summer Jazz concerts were discussed. It was concluded that the Society's community participation and visibility was as important as profits derived therefrom. The motion to continue said food service passed unanimously.
3. A Certificate of Appreciation was presented to Alan and Joan Kindle December 4 at the Magee House Christmas party. They in turn gave the Society sheet music from Carrillo's home for display at Magee House.
4. Natalie Vermilyea donated a video tape of early Carlsbad for use at Magee House and it was enjoyed by members and guests attending.

## NEW BUSINESS:

1. A eucalyptus tree on Society property needed to be trimmed. Motion to pay the \$125 carried unanimously.
2. The office at Holiday Park was burned by vandals, so the Park & Recreation will meet at Magee House for next two months.
3. Lorraine Utzelman presented Magee House two pieces of folk art created by Women's Club members and framed with rulers

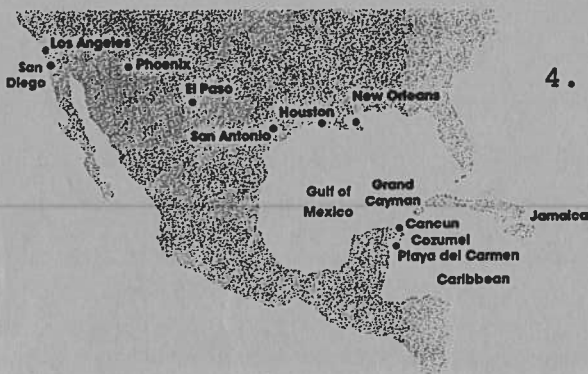

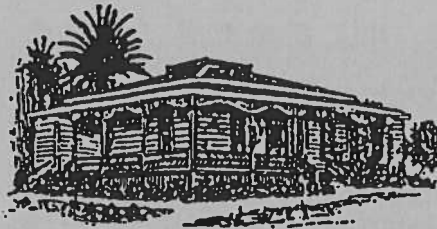

BOARD MEETING MAY 18

Held at Magee House, acting-President Eleanore Hardman opened the meeting at 9:00 AM. Attending were Don Christiansen, Jeannette Smale, Mari Andersson, Edward Maiuro, Lorna and Charles Letts, Lorraine Utzelman, Kay Christiansen, and Ludvik Grigoras.

Grigoras presented a proposal regarding a special property agreement, which could provide financial backing and pay for the building (part of the building to Christiansen International and part to the Historical Society). Each party to pay its own utilities like a townhouse arrangement.

Following discussion, it was moved and seconded that the Board accept the proposal to share the property (211 x 60 Parcel 20317302) and building according to equities: Historical Society will receive a proportion of the building and the city requirement parking without any debts. The motion passed.

Maiuro reported that he had discussed with the County Assessor the Society's tax situation. Because of the lack of a building on the lot, the Society was given until March 1995 as the deadline to qualify for an exemption.

The Sunday, March 20, membership tea from one to five at Magee House, and the Pacific Coast Concert Band program in the park, was successful both in attendance and financially.

Mari Andersson reported that she, Amelia Irvine, Orpha Froblom, Kay Christiansen, Marge Howard-Jones, Ann and Stephen L'Heureux attended the May 10 Save Our Heritage Organization "12th Annual People in Preservation Awards Dinner." Joan and Alan Kindle received the Community Education Award for their efforts on behalf of the Leo Carrillo Ranch education program.

Don Christiansen reported on the two-week trip "By Rail and Sea to New Orleans, the Caribbean and Mystic Yucatan" sponsored by the Society and XPO America Lifelong Learning, Inc. Mariachi del Sol band bade a musical adios May 17 as the North County group embarked on the train from the Carlsbad depot. Amtrak chose to allow this one-time-only stop as a goodwill gesture to the Historical Society.

Other business included Ed Maiuro working with the city on closing off Carlsbad Blvd. between Grand and Christiansen Way July 24 from 2:00 to 6:00 PM for the July 24 Commemorative Ceremony of the reopening of John A. Fraizer's former artesian mineral spring.

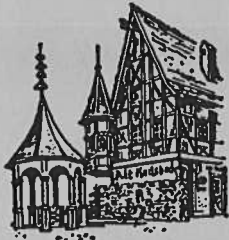
Lorna and Charles Letts will handle refreshments to be served at the Carlsbad-by-the-Sea Lutheran Home following the July 24

### JOHN A. FRAIZER'S STATUE

To complete the restoration of Fraizer's mineral water spring, the Carlsbad Historical Society and Christiansen International felt a statue of the retired sea captain, considered the founder of Carlsbad in 1881, was needed.

Carlsbad, California and Karlovy-Vary, Czech Republic, are Sister Cities. The latter city's former mayor, Vaclav Lokvenc is an artist whose work is displayed in galleries all over Europe. Lokvenc offered his time and talent to create a 10-foot tall bronze-plated statue of Fraizer, which will be placed against the right wall of the Alt Carlsbad Village complex.

Lokvenc was aware with the reopening of Frazier's mineral spring and future spa plans. a new chapter in Alt Carlsbad had horizoned.

Therefore, he agreed that a statue of Frazier was required. He is donating his time and talent at a cost of \$20,000, including shipping. The quality and size of this statue if made in the United States would cost over \$200,000 and not have the same historical value.

The names of individuals, companies or organizations donating a \$1000 or more will be engraved under Fraizer's awesome statue. Other donors will receive a Certificate of Appreciation. To date, we still need \$10,000. The statue will arrive the latter part of December.

**ALT KARLSBAD HISTORICAL CEREMONY - SUNDAY, JULY, 24, 1994**

**OFFICIAL OPENING OF CARLSBAD MINERAL WATER WELL**

In June 1993, Kay Christiansen, Ludvik and Veronica Grigoras formed the Christian Company. Grigoras, an internationally known instrumental engineer, began work on reopening John A. Frazier's original artesian mineral spring.

Plugged up since the well was closed in 1936, Grigoras stated at the January 19 Society Board Meeting that the well has been cleaned out and now daily pumps about 24,000 gallons of water. The water has been tested and the current mineral content is higher than it was first discovered by Frazier in 1882. He revealed plans for building 14 private room spas across from Alt Karlsbad.

Alt Karlsbad was built in 1964 by Chris and Kay Christiansen. The three-story building is an authentic replica of a German Hanseatic League house as is the two-story structure a replica of Czech composer Antonin Dvorak's Bohemia home in Karlsbad, now Karlovy Vary. The official opening of the well on July 24 coincides with the 100th anniversary of Dvorak's best known symphony From the New World that was premiered in Karlsbad, Bohemia, July 24, 1884.

The Christiansen Company felt the restoration of the well would not be complete without a statue of Fraizer, founder of Carlsbad. Former Mayor of Karlovy Vary, Czechoslovakia, Vaclav Lokvenc, is sculpting a bronze-plated seven-foot statue of Fraizer. It should be completed before 1995. Lokvenc's art is displayed in galleries all over Europe. He is donating his time and talent. The total cost will be \$20,000 including shipping.

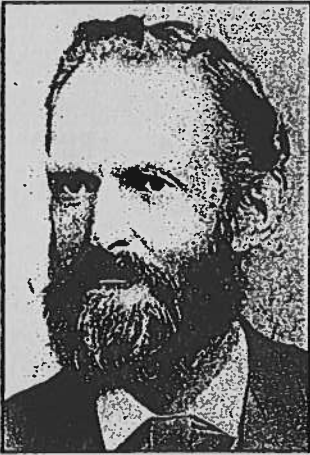

## FRAZIER'S VISION OF HEALING WATERS COMES FULL CIRCLE

John A. Fraizer, the retired sea captain considered the founding father of Carlsbad, was born on a farm in Rhode Island July 18, 1832. He went to sea with an uncle when he was only thirteen. According to an August 27 1887, "Dictation taken from Captain J. A. Fraizer at Carlsbad, CA," (copied from the original in the Bancroft Library, University of California, Berkeley), "The narrative of his life is full of daring feats and thrilling adventures." His experiences in almost every country in the world would make a prime time TV adventure show.

Frazier left the sea in 1860. In 1881 while living in Los Angeles he founded the Good Samaritan mission to help the city's helpless poor. A year latter he came to San Diego and rode the California Southern train to where it stopped a mile north of Aqua Hedionda. Visionary Fraizer knew the coastal lands were fertile and decided to become a farmer.

He chose a site for his home about a block from the shore, though the nearest potable water was three miles away. Using his gift of diving, he discovered water. He was able to bore and drill to a depth of 415 feet, which produced a stream of artesian mineral water. Tests proved it was almost identical in chemical composition to the water of Well No. 9 at the world-famous spa in Karlsbad, Bohemia. Fraizer found the water cured his stomach and kidney disorders.

This well was to make history and become the beginning of Carlsbad. Frazier built a 50-foot wooden well tower just west of where Carlsbad and Cedar Street now meet. He piped water to a barrel on the train platform, and offered passengers drinks. Frazier bottled his water and sold it across the country.

In 1886, a 100-room hotel was built. Testimonies from those whose health had been regained by drinking the water was reinforced by medical opinions substantiating their claims. In 1896 the hotel burned down. An economic lull settled over Carlsbad. Fraizer decided to move back to Los Angeles where he died in July 17, 1899.

In 1929 the California Mineral Springs Hotel was built. A new pipe from the old well ran under Lincoln St. (now Carlsbad Blvd.) across to its north wing spa and diagnostic clinic. The depression came along. Use of the spa stopped. The well plugged up.

One hundred and twelve years after Frazier's incredible discovery made history, his therapeutic and healing waters are again flowing. In the Christiansen Company's spas, a new history of healing has horized.

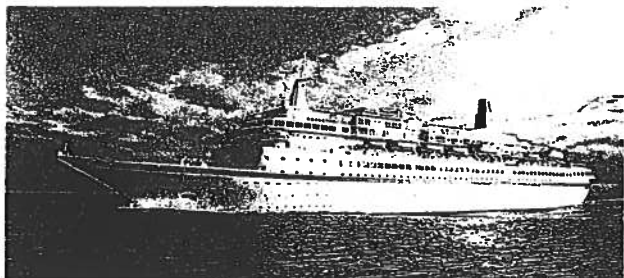
Perhaps you were on holiday, or just overlooked?

**1 9 9 4 - A YEAR OF INCREDIBLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

Sunday 24 July, the 3:00 PM premiere reopening of Frazier's well ceremony began a new chapter in Carlsbad's precious resource. Sister City Karlovy Vary, Czech Republic, Mayor Ing. Miroslava Storkanova and Councilmen Mudr. Jan Podlipny and Ing. Jiri Bucek honored the historic occasion with their presence.

The idea of a statue of Frazier, known as the founding father of Carlsbad, was considered. When Vaclav Lokvenc, a former Karlovy Vary Mayor agreed to donate his time and talent to create a 10-foot bronze plate monument for \$20,000.00 including cost of material and shipping, the Society began a fund raiser. \$1000.00 donors names will be on a plaque at the statue base. All other contributors were acknowledged by a special thank you card.

On a separate page you will find the names of all the caring citizens, organizations and companies whose donations made it possible to gift the city with this awesome contribution to Carlsbad's historical heritage.

Sunday, 4 December at 2:00 PM, the dedication rites were held. The artist and his son Jan came to Carlsbad on our Thanksgiving to personally install his sculpture. The first of his work to be displayed in the United States, it is placed in front of the south wall of Alt Karlsbad.

On both occasions Carlsbad By The Sea, a California Lutheran Home, the former California Mineral Springs Hotel, graciously hosted the receptions following. Now, we learn the building does not meet the new seismic ordinance. Plans include retention or replication of the historic facade facing Carlsbad Blvd. However, the construction project will not start before mid-1996.
